

Lung Cancer: America's Number One Cancer Killer

Lung cancer is by far the leading cause of cancer deaths among both men and women in the United States. Each year, more people die of lung cancer than of colon, breast, and prostate cancers combined.

Early detection increases chances of survival. In fact, more than 380,000 people alive today were diagnosed with lung cancer at some point.

Low Dose Screening CT Scans Can Reduce Lung Cancer Deaths

Results of the National Lung Screening Trial (NLST) indicate low-dose screening CT scans may reduce lung cancer mortality by more than 20%, by identifying early stage cancers.

Who Should Be Tested?

The National Lung Screening Trial (NLST) suggests that individuals who meet the following guidelines should receive a Lung Cancer Screening CT Exam:

- Individuals between the ages of 55-77 who are current or former smokers.
- Individuals with a history of at least 30 "pack years" of smoking. (A pack year equals the number of packs smoked per day times the number of years you've smoked.)
- Former smokers who have quit within the past 15 years.

Will My Insurance Pay For It?

Most insurance plans, including Medicare, will require prior authorization for this exam. If you don't have insurance or can't get prior authorization, you'll be required to pay in-full at the time of the exam.

Do I Need a Referral From My Doctor?

Yes, if you meet the guidelines, you're free to ask your regular doctor to refer you to Inland Imaging for a low-dose Lung Cancer Screening Exam.

Products To Help You Stop Smoking

The nicotine patch is worn on the skin, doses are gradually lowered as the treatment progresses.

Nicotine gum releases nicotine into the bloodstream through the lining of the mouth.

The nicotine lozenge is similar to that of nicotine gum; it is placed between the cheek and gum tissue and allowed to dissolve.

Nicotine nasal spray comes in a pump bottle containing nicotine that tobacco users can inhale when they have an urge to smoke.

A nicotine inhaler, also available only by prescription, delivers a vaporized form of nicotine.
